Shaping Positive Futures **Learner Conference 2023**

On Thursday, 12 January 2023, 300 of our learners gathered together at the University of Hull to take part in our first ever Trust wide Learner Conference.

The conference was the brainchild of Julia Lovel, Lead Practitioner at Holderness, who is passionate about providing a forum to ensure all our young people have a voice. She was particularly keen that our learners have every opportunity to engage with each other and so all nine of our schools were represented, along with learners from our four sixth form campuses with the breakdown including 20 from each primary, 30 from each secondary and 15 from each sixth form.

The learners travelled to the conference by coach, were greeted by staff as they arrived and escorted through the university grounds by way of a whistlestop tour of the campus. This helped to set the aspirational nature of the day. The theme of the conference was Diversity and Inclusion. The event started with a keynote speech by Martin from the Art of Brilliance, who colleagues will remember from our October CPD Event. Martin presents regularly to a wide range of audiences around the world, but admitted to feeling apprehensive before the event, having never delivered a session to such a wide range of ages, from 4 – 18 years old. Learners embraced his message that "...everyone is a somebody."

Each learner received a Shaping Positive Futures tote bag, containing an age specific novel on the theme of diversity and inclusion, a notebook, pen and rainbow pencil.

They also received a selection of coloured counters which they were encouraged to swap with other learners over the course of the day as they made new connections, ending the day with a rainbow of different colours illustrating how many new people they had engaged with.

Delegate badges were provided which highlighted which room learners should head to for their workshops. Our youngest children took part in Now Press Play, an award-winning immersive audio resource that engages primary school children in the curriculum through sound, story and movement. These sessions were based around bullying. Older learners took part in a more hands on workshop with Martin whilst all ages engaged in the 'Design a Shaping Positive Futures Award' workshop. Further details will be shared on the criteria for this new learner centric award.

Across lunch time, learners had the chance to 'Make their Mark' by drawing around their hands and writing messages expressing their thoughts about the day.

A range of external providers set up stalls and gave out advice and freebies to our learners, all on the theme of diversity and inclusion and what it means to their organisation. This was a huge success, particularly with our primary children who were very brave both in engaging with the adults and battling through the crowds. It added another element to the day and we were very grateful that local businesses gave their time to support the event. The day ended with each learner and staff member being presented with a gold Shaping Positive Futures commemorative Trust badge.


